## 17/86. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

**Minute No 17/79/(a), Ward Budget Allocation:** Cllr J. Campbell reported that he would be attending a meeting of ward chairmen and District Cllr S. Tong to discuss the allocation of the ward budget on "6<sup>th</sup> September 2017. Suggested items for consideration were 1) Community Sign for Witchampton First School, 2) Upgrading the disabled toilets at the Drover's Inn and the experiment with wildflower verges.

## 17/87. COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

#### Cllr Mr S. Butler

- a. <u>Local government Reform</u>: Nothing has been heard from the Secretary of State on the subject of Local Government Reform and the 2019 deadline implementation is unlikely to be met. The idea of having rural Mayors appears to have been put on hold for the time being.
- b. **East Dorset District Council:** the District Council is still on budget and should be within the guidelines for the next financial year.
- c. <u>Planning Training:</u> while the planning training was useful it highlighted the fact the current process is very confusing and that enforcement is poor.
- d. <u>Health & Wellbeing:</u> The district Council is introducing Dementia Walks at West Moors Country Park. There is a G.P. referral system in place for exercise; e.g. gym membership, swimming and walking. Volunteers are being trained as helpers. There is also a scheme in Christchurch that is helping people to learn how to cook meals from scratch. It is planned to extend the scheme to Heatherlands, Tricketts Cross in the near future.
- e. **Dorset County Council Budget:** To make the necessary savings, jobs are not being filled and the capital programme is being delayed. The intervention in early years support is being re-shaped to help families early in order to prevent problems later on when they are more entrenched. This is partly through the setting up of a Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub comprised of police, social workers, health visitors and education departments working together on any serious referrals that occur. The system appears to be working well and is solving problems that arise.
