17/50. APOLOGIES

- a. The Parish Clerk reported that Mr David Gill had informed her of his resignation as Councillor for Hinton Ward (Gaunts Common). This leaves three unfilled vacancies for the Hinton Ward which are available for cooption.
- b. Apologies were received from, Cllr Mrs M. Cook.

17/51. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST IN ITEMS ON THE AGENDA

There were no declarations of interest to report.

17/52. REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS TO PARTICIPATE IN A MEETING

There were no requests for dispensations to report.

17/53. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SESSION

- a. **Mr King, Gussage All Saints:** Mr King spoke regarding the appeal that has been lodged on Planning Application 3/17/0832, Southfield, Gussage All Saints. He commented on some of the anomalies contained in the decision notice issued by the District Council.
- b. Mr & Mrs Dickinson, Gussage All Saints: Planning Application 3/17/1497, Peel House, (adjacent to vicarage cottage) Gussage All Saints. the original planning application was for three houses, only two of which were built. An existing covenant has been released to allow the third house to be built. The current application is a bit smaller than the original. Although a bat survey was negative, on the advice of Natural England it is intended to install bat boxes in the surrounding trees.
- c. **Mr & Mrs Farmer, Gussage All Saints:** Planning Application 3/17/1497, Peel House, (adjacent to vicarage cottage) Gussage All Saints. Mr & Mrs Farmer objected to the application on the grounds that the proposed development, being prominent and intrusive, would have an adverse effect on the west end of the village;. The area will lose its open aspect with its clear view of the village church.

The Parish Council comments were that (a) the visibility of the proposed agricultural building had been overstated and that it would not be intrusive and (b) the decision notice is incorrect as there is an existing access track into the field so there is no need to build another one.

17/58. DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

1759/. PARISH CLERK'S REPORT

- a. **Planning Training:** Members attending the training session on 13th July 2017 reported that the session was very useful in clarifying the numerous changes that have been initiated by Government legislation. A summary of the topics covered is held on file.
- b. **Dorset Wildlife Trust:** The Clerk reported that she had contacted Mr Steve Davies who is in charge of verge cutting for the County Council, stating that the Parish council wishes to take over the management of some of the verges in the Vale of Allen to encourage a wider variety of wildflowers. There has not been any reply so far.
- c. **Witchampton First School:** It was resolved to support the Wimborne First School in its bid for a portion of the District Council ward budget allocation.
- d. **Manswood Play Area**: It was reported that the Clerk had written to Mr Iain Davey-Smith of The Buildings, Manswood informing him that the Parish Council has agreed to allow the residents to maintain the Manswood Play

- Area for a twelve month trial period and asking for an on site meeting to discuss the requirements.
- e. **Affordable Housing**: It was reported that the Clerk has arranged for Bryony Stevens to attend the Parish Council meeting on 22nd August 2017 to discuss the proposed housing needs Survey. The meeting will start half an hour earlier to allow time for a full discussion of the questionnaire.
- f. **Improving Local Rights of Way:** see above minute 17/55(b) Matters Arising from the Minutes.
- g. Burial Ground Extension: The Clerk reported that once again she has written to Savills about the donation of the paddock adjacent to the burial ground as an extension to the graveyard to ensure sufficient space for future generations of residents. Although there is no great urgency in this matter, the paddock is not being properly maintained
- h. Road Signs and Markings Stanbridge Mill: Cllr Mr R. Hill reported that he had been in contact with Mrs Julie Straughan (who lives near the mill), about the alarming number of accidents occurring on the bend leading to the narrow single file stretch of the C2 road located just beyond Stanbridge Mill. The Clerk was asked to contact Mr Andrew Martin and Mr Pat Waterman to see if anything can be done about improving the wording and the location of the advance warning signs and also refreshing the "SLOW" road markings leading up to and beyond the mill.

DCC Report July 2017, Steve Butler

Local Government Reform (LGR). With the Parliamentary Summer Recess started the Secretary of State, Sajid Javid, is unlikely to make any "minded to" decision before the Autumn and the start of any LGR seems likely to drift on towards Christmas. This puts greater strain on to what was already a tight schedule and the likelihood of any new unitary system being put in place in time for the local elections in 2019 appears less and less likely.

Clinical Services Review (CSR) The number of people living in Dorset is growing and is set to rise by around 50,000 by 2020. More people are living longer with more long-term conditions like diabetes and dementia. This will increase demand for, and pressure on, our health and social care system. To this end the Dorset Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) have held a review the results of which have been out to consultation to the public, patients and wider stakeholders. The plans propose making Bournemouth an A&E Hospital, Poole an Acute Hospital and Dorchester to continue as a hybrid, with the closure of St. Leonards and Shaftsbury Cottage Hospitals and more care in the community deemed to be the way forward. As can be assumed the folks of Purbeck were unhappy that A&E would be further away and the folks of Shaftsbury unhappy their cottage hospital was to close. The CCG's responses to the consultation are expected in September.

Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP) The other big ticket item for Dorset is the STP. A local partnership made up of the Dorset CCG, 1st tier local govt (Bournemouth, Dorset and Poole) and the NHS Trusts (the 3 Hospitals, Dorset Healthcare University and the South Western Ambulance Service) have created a 3 tier template to provide services that will meet the needs of local people. 1) Prevention at scale: helping people to stay healthy and avoid getting unwell. 2) Integrated community services: creating community hubs with and without beds that combine health and care services.3) One acute network: transforming acute services in Dorset so they meet the complex and specialist needs of the local population. Dorset has good NHS services but change is vital to meet the challenges of an ageing population and rising demand, too much variation in the quality of services, unacceptable inequalities in life expectancy and workforce and financial pressures.

DCC Budget Deficit. The County Council continues working hard to fix our potential budget deficit. The 3 main areas of concern are:-

- 1) Special Educational Need (SEN) Transport. All children with a SEN Plan who need to travel more than 3 miles for their education are entitled to free transport. Rationalisation of routes and transport carers has been taking place and we expect to make saving starting in September.
- 2) Looked after children (LAC). The county is looking to streamline the recruitment and training of new in house foster careers for our children in care to help minimise the use of expensive Independent Fostering Agencies.
- 3) Agency Staff. The county has reviewed its use of agency social workers and upgraded the recruitment process increasing the offer to new graduate social workers and create a new working model called "Reinvigorating Social Work" which will ensure our social working spend more time with our clients.
