The Hinton Martell Fountain, nestled in the picturesque village of Hinton Martell near Wimborne, in Dorset, stands as a timeless testament to both historical grandeur and natural beauty. Historically it is believed it was for animals to drink from, but when Witchampton Mill Owner, Mr Burt, moved from Witchampton to Hinton Martell, he used the spring water from Pipers Hill for his personal supply, and the residents of Hinton Martell and created the fountain as an overflow. The Hinton Martell Fountain holds significant historical importance to the local community representing the rich history and traditions of the village.

It was erected during the late 19th century, and its presence has witnessed the passage of time, silently preserving the memories of bygone eras. It stands as a symbol of the village's heritage, reminding all who encounter it of the rich history and traditions of the area.

Beyond both its architectural and historical significance, the Hinton Martell Fountain serves as a vital community gathering point. 
Preservation & Restoration.

The Hinton Martell Fountain is an iconic landmark in our community, serving as a historical, cultural, and aesthetic centrepiece. However, over the years, it has fallen into disrepair and no longer reflects the pride and beauty it once did. It is our responsibility to restore this treasured monument to its former glory.

This prospectus outlines the objectives, scope, budget, and potential benefits of this refurbishment project. It has recently been inspected by a local Structural Engineer who says "it is not economically worthwhile to renovate, it needs a complete rebuild" given the extent of the disrepair.

The primary objectives of the refurbishment project for the Hinton Martell Fountain are as follows:

- Restoration: To restore the fountain to its original splendour, preserving its historical and architectural significance.
- Safety: To ensure that the fountain complies with modern safety standards, sustainability and minimising any potential hazards to the community and the public.
- Community Revitalization: To revitalize the area surrounding the fountain, making it a welcoming, clean, safe space for residents and visitors alike. A new bench was recently installed which is used by many, of all ages.

The scope of this project will encompass the following key components:

Restoration: Comprehensive restoration and rebuilding of the fountain's structure, in conjunction with the Conservation Officer at Dorset Council, as the fountain is of significant architectural heritage interest to Dorset.

Replacing: The concrete base, replacing the Fountain Bowl, and refurbishing the Cupid Centrepiece. Repositioning the utilities box for the electricity and water supplies.

Plumbing and Mechanical Systems: Upgrading and modernizing the fountain's plumbing and mechanical systems to ensure proper functionality and longevity.

Accessibility: Ensuring that the fountain is safely accessible for the enjoyment all individuals.



A preliminary budget estimate for the refurbishment of the Hinton Martell Fountain is estimated to be £25,000 - £30,000.

The refurbishment of the Hinton Martell Fountain promises numerous benefits for our community as the project will restore and preserve an invaluable historical landmark, ensuring its legacy for future generations both residing in the village or visiting.
